Prof. Zoran Jolevski, Ph.D, Vice Rector for international cooperation at European University in Skopje

Ambassador Jolevski is vice-rector for international cooperation at the European University Skopje. In 2021 and the first half of 2022, Professor Jolevski was a Fellow at Harvard University. In addition to the European



University Skopje, he also teaches at top American and European universities. Ambassador Zoran Jolevski has 30 years of academic, diplomatic, managerial and consulting experience in the field of diplomacy, international trade, international development, national security, public-private dialogue and private sector development. Professor Jolevski is currently a consultant for several multinational companies.

Dr. Jolevski served as a Minister of Defense and as an Ambassador to the United States. Professor Jolevski was Secretary General of the Cabinet of the late Macedonian President Boris Trajkovski. He was also the main advisor to the Macedonian Government for accession to the World Trade Organization. He worked in various positions in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs from 1988 to 1999, including first secretary in the Permanent Mission of Macedonia to the UN headquarters in Geneva from 1994 to 1999, and in 1999 he was the deputy national coordinator for the Kosovo refugee crisis.

Professor Jolevski was a member of the boards of several companies and non-governmental organizations and held several positions in the United Nations bodies in the field of international trade. Ambassador Jolevski is the President of the Institute for Strategic Initiatives and Policies as well as the Chairman of the Advisory Board of the Ambassador's Round Table, in San Diego, USA. Dr. Jolevski was honorary member of the Board of "Macedonia 2025", and currently he is member of Advisory Board. He was founder and the first President of the Institute for Economic Strategies and International Affairs – "Ohrid", and served also as the President of "The Boris Trajkovski International Foundation". He served as a the President of the Art Colony Debarca for several years. He was a member of the Presidency of Macedonian Euro-Atlantic Club, from 2004 to 2005.

Jolevski holds a Ph.D. in International Economy from the School of Economics, University of "Cyril and Metodij", as well as a Master of Science in International Trade Law from the Law School at the same University. He is teaching at the European University in Skopje. He has authored three books and has been the chief editor of several books. He is the author of more than fifty articles.
